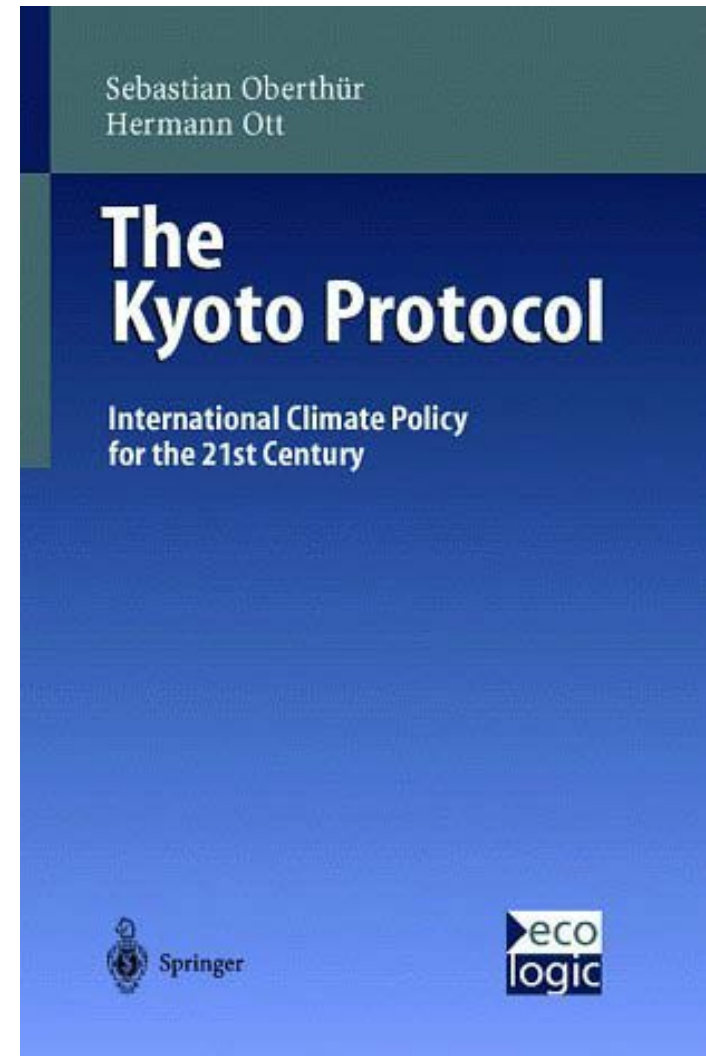

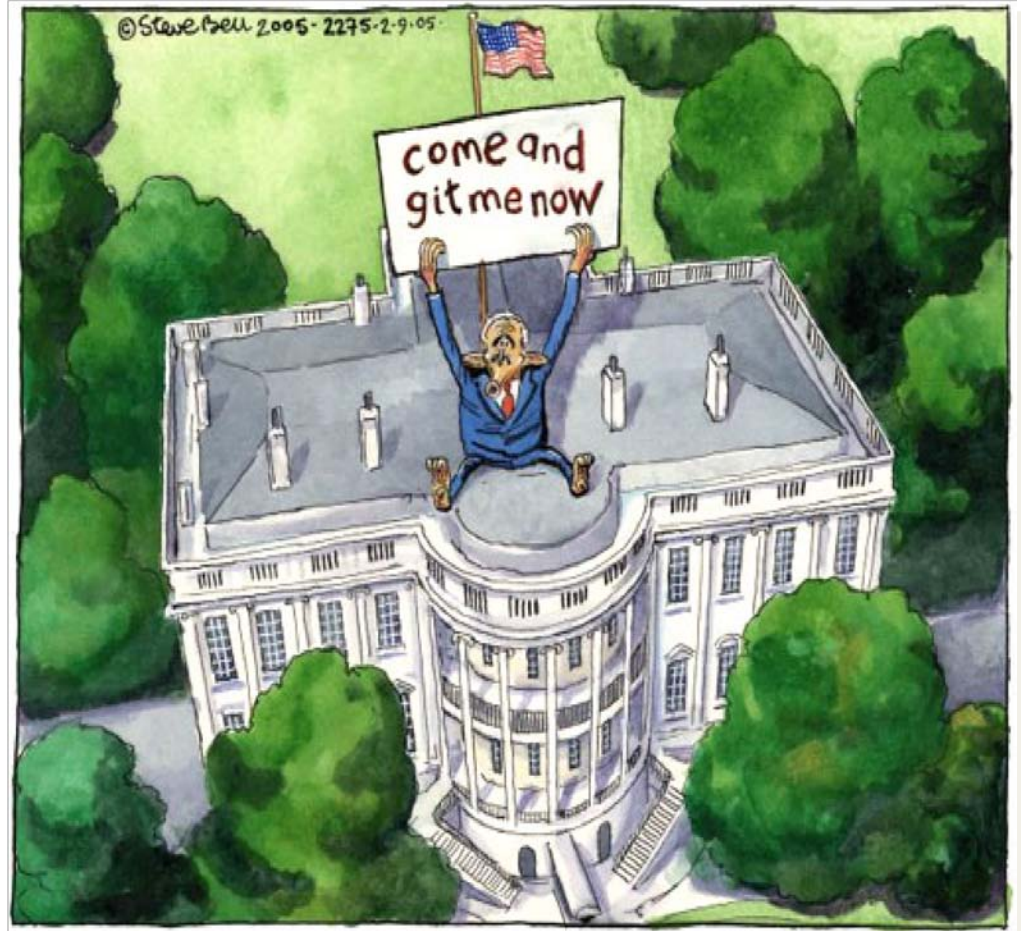


Climate Politics

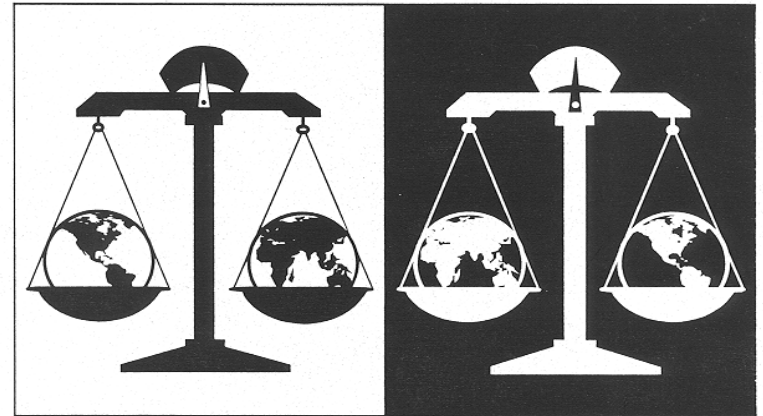
